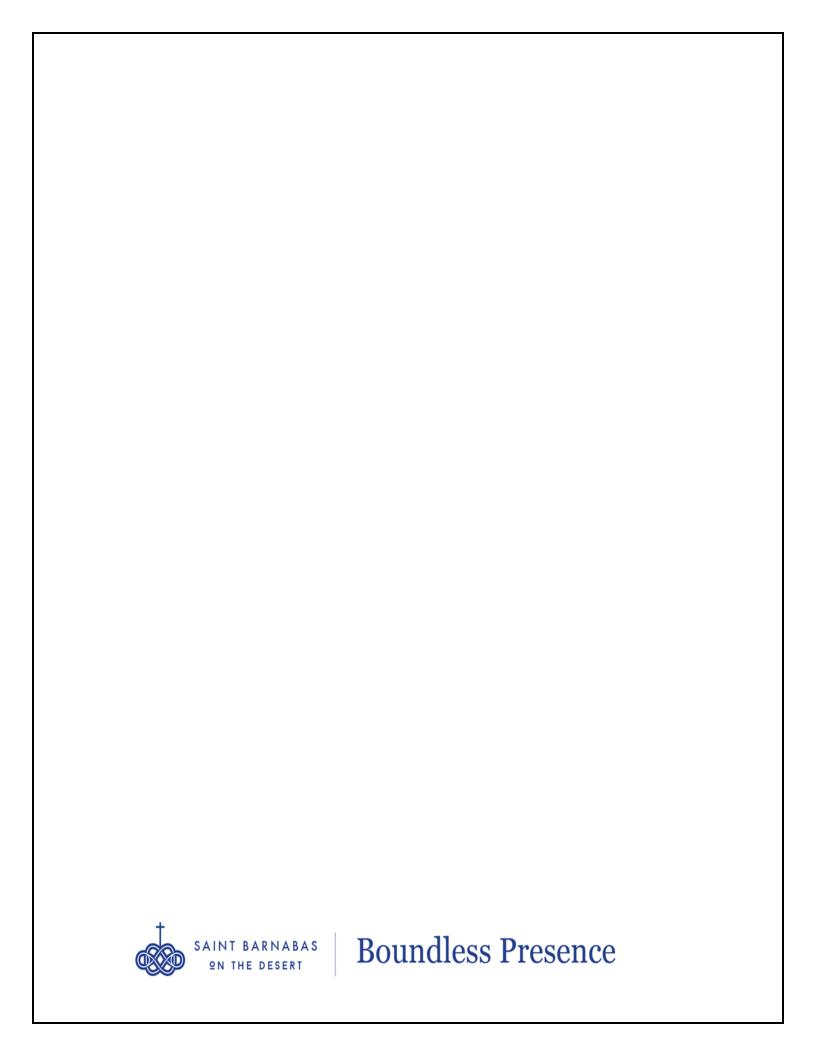

2015 Annual Meeting Minutes

January 25, 2015 Saint Barnabas on the Desert

<u>Opening</u> – Organist and Choirmaster Paul Lee led all present in several hymns. Senior Warden David Getts called the meeting to order at 12:05 p.m. and invited all to participate in the elections. Junior Warden Susie Parker led those present in a prayer.

<u>Appointment of Clerk & Approval of 2014 Minutes</u> – A motion was made to appoint Ann Hott as Clerk. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved by voice acclamation. A motion was made to approve the minutes of the 2014 meeting. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved by voice acclamation.

<u>Thank You Announcements</u> – Rector Jim Clark led all present in thanking 2014 Diocesan Convention Delegates Andy Fotis, Kristin Iacobelli, Heather Heroldt, Scott Johnson, Alice MacArthur, Joyce Nichols, Nick Nichols, John Stone, Ed Wimmer, and Tim Vinger. Outgoing Vestry members Tom Baker, Pam Bell, Cathryn Mayers, and Karen Steckler and outgoing Junior Warden Susie Parker were thanked for their service.

<u>Nominations and Elections</u> – Sky Larsen, Chair of the 2014 Vestry Nominating Committee, presented the nominees selected by the Committee for Junior Warden, Vestry, and Diocesan Convention Delegates and Alternates.

- For Junior Warden, Carol Okin was placed in nomination. David asked for nominations from the floor. Hearing none, the vote was called. Carol Okin was unanimously elected by voice acclamation.
- To complete the term vacated by Sue Briggs, Jim Hoselton was placed in nomination for a one-year term on Vestry. Jim had been appointed in August 2014 to fill Sue's vacancy until this Annual Meeting. A motion was made to elect Jim, the motion was seconded, and Jim was unanimously elected by voice acclamation.
- Sky then presented Barb Chotras, Fionn Downhill, John Farley, and Patrick Waugh as nominees for three-year terms on Vestry. David asked for nominations from the floor. There were none. The vote was called. All nominees were unanimously elected by voice acclamation.
- The following people were nominated as Delegates and Alternate Delegates for the 2015 Arizona Diocesan Convention: As Delegates Sue Dietrich, Tom Dietrich, Joyce Nichols, Nick Nichols, and Alex Vinger. As alternates, to serve if these Delegates are not able to serve: Larry Brainard, Bonnie Lebeck, Donna Piscopo, Jim Piscopo, and Karen Steckler. David asked for additional nominations from the floor. Hearing none, David asked for a motion to elect the candidates. The motion was made and seconded and the vote was called. The nominees were elected by unanimous voice acclamation.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> – Treasurer Linda Killmer presented and reviewed the 2014 Financial Overview of St. Barnabas. (Document attached and incorporated herein). She noted that the Budget for 2014 had forecast a year-end income to expenses result of \$13,344. The year closed with an actual income to expenses surplus result of (\$1631.)

Senior Warden's Report -

Capital Needs Review Committee – David announced the formation of a new committee to assess the capital and maintenance needs of the campus. This group would review project costs and set priorities for work to be done. The goal is to maintain the integrity of this beautiful place. David invited everyone interested in participating to contact him.

<u>Stewardship Report</u> – Chairman Jim Berg and members of the Stewardship Committee were thanked for their service during the fall Stewardship campaign. Jim Clark reported that for 2015 St. Barnabas has received 432 pledges totaling \$1,549,824. Jim thanked the congregation for their generous response.

Rector's Report -

The status of initiatives from the season of discernment, new chairs in the chapel, new playground construction and construction of a labyrinth were shared. All of the initiatives are fully funded. New chapel chairs are in use; allowing multiple uses for this space on campus. The new playground will be installed this spring. A master plan for the labyrinth is completed; plans to phase construction are being developed. It is the intent that, when completed, the labyrinth garden will have the same 'feel,' with large trees and shade areas, of the memorial garden.

As shared in his morning preaching, Jim restated that he sees the call of Saint Barnabas is to grow. The emphasis will be on the three new services – the 10:21, a Saturday night service. known as 'SNL', in the fall, and expansion of the children's worship services. He emphasized that the clergy and staff cannot grow the church – all of the parish must be involved in this effort. There will be opportunities during Lent for parishioners to gather in small groups to talk about how to grow Saint Barnabas. Although it is fair to argue that we should stay where we are, it is our mission to change the world, to become the best Saint Barnabas we can be. Status and plans for the gift for growth that was received in 2014 were shared, including how funds were used in 2014 and the budget for use of these funds in the next two years. The 2015 budget for operating expenses was presented. Jim explained that, though the total of pledges is \$1,549,824, the operating budget plans an anticipated pledge income total of \$1,482,900. This difference adjustment is aligned with the percentage of dollars received to dollars pledged received in the last 5 years. News of a separate \$50,000 special gift was also shared. This gift, separate from the gift in the 'growth gift' budget, will be used to support the operating budget during the transition, as the church is focused on initiatives to grow. The budget anticipates a deficit of \$59,364. It is important that we understand the difference between the growth gift and the operating expenses budget and the reason that the 2015 budget is beginning with a planned deficit. We are thriving but we need to invest in reinventing ourselves to remain a thriving church. We have a deficit because we will be focused on growth initiatives, hoping in that way to attract more pledging households and also so that as our people see that we have more needs they may also be inspired to help us more in this mission.

David Getts, as Senior Warden, resumed the podium. David shared that the Vestry met in special session on January 16 and, after full discussion of the plan and review of both the growth gift budget and operating expenses budget, had voiced full support. The 2015 budget as presented today is the budget approved by the Vestry at that meeting.

A period of general discussion and clarifying questions ensued. Support for the plans was voiced. Tammy Underwood asked that the parish join her in thanking Sexton Rudy Mills and members of the Mills family. All present joined applause and gratitude. Discussion ended.
