

# Liturgy of the Word with Holy Communion

*A note about tonight's liturgy: Deacons and priests serve different liturgical functions in our worship. Deacons are ordained to lead the congregation in proclamation of the Good News and in promoting service to the world. Priests are ordained to lead the congregation in the celebration of the sacraments, including the consecration of the Eucharistic elements. When a deacon presides at the 6pm service, she proclaims the Good News and offers bread and wine that was consecrated by a priest.*

## Opening Acclamation

*Deacon* Blessed be God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

*People* **And blessed be God's kingdom, now and forever. Amen.**

## Collect for Purity

*Deacon* Almighty God, to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

## A Song of Praise

*The Song of Simeon (Luke 2:29-32)*

*All* **Lord, you now have set your servant free to go in peace as you have promised; For these eyes of mine have seen the Savior, whom you have prepared for all the world to see: A light to enlighten the nations, and the glory of your people Israel.**

## The Collect of the Day

*Deacon* The Lord be with you.

*People* **And also with you.**

*Deacon* Let us pray. (*silence*) Give us grace, O Lord, to answer readily the call of our Savior Jesus Christ and proclaim to all people the Good News of his salvation, that we and the whole world may perceive the glory of his marvelous works; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

# The Word of God

Please be seated.

The First Reading

Jonah 3: 1-5,10

Reader

A reading from the Book of the Prophet Jonah.

<sup>1</sup>The word of the LORD came to Jonah a second time, saying, <sup>2</sup>“Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you.” <sup>3</sup>So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the LORD.

Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. <sup>4</sup>Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. And he cried out, “Forty days more, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!” <sup>5</sup>And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and everyone, great and small, put on sackcloth.

<sup>10</sup>When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, God changed his mind about the calamity that he had said he would bring upon them; and he did not do it.

Psalm 62: 6-14

Reader

<sup>6</sup> For God alone my soul in silence waits; \*  
**truly, my hope is in him.**

<sup>7</sup> He alone is my rock and my salvation, \*  
**my stronghold, so that I shall not be shaken.**

<sup>8</sup> In God is my safety and my honor; \*  
**God is my strong rock and my refuge.**

<sup>9</sup> Put your trust in him always, O people, \*  
**pour out your hearts before him, for God is our refuge.**

<sup>10</sup> Those of high degree are but a fleeting breath, \*  
**even those of low estate cannot be trusted.**

<sup>11</sup> On the scales they are lighter than a breath, \*  
**all of them together.**

<sup>12</sup> Put no trust in extortion;  
in robbery take no empty pride; \*  
**though wealth increase, set not your heart upon it.**

<sup>13</sup> God has spoken once, twice have I heard it, \*  
**that power belongs to God.**

<sup>14</sup> Steadfast love is yours, O Lord, \*  
**for you repay everyone according to his deeds.**

The Holy Gospel

Mark 1: 14-20

*Deacon* The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

*People* **Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

<sup>14</sup>After John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, <sup>15</sup>and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news."

<sup>16</sup>As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the sea—for they were fishermen.

<sup>17</sup>And Jesus said to them, "Follow me and I will make you fish for people." <sup>18</sup>And immediately they left their nets and followed him. <sup>19</sup>As he went a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John, who were in their boat mending the nets. <sup>20</sup>Immediately he called them; and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men, and followed him.

The Sermon

The Nicene Creed

*Reader* Please stand as we affirm our faith in the words of the Nicene Creed.

*All* **We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.**

*Deacon*            Blessed are You, Lord God of all creation. Through Your goodness we share these tithes and offerings which are symbols of our life and labor; may they be used in Your Church for the work of furthering of Your Kingdom.

*People*            **Blessed be God forever.**

## The Holy Communion

*Deacon*            And now as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to pray:

*All*                **Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.**

*All who seek Christ are invited to receive Communion. Receive the bread in your cupped hands and then either guide the cup to your mouth to drink the wine or dip the wafer into the wine. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request.*

*All*                **Eternal God, heavenly Father, you have graciously accepted us as living members of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ, and you have fed us with spiritual food in the Sacrament of his Body and Blood. Send us now into the world in peace, and grant us strength and courage to love and serve you with gladness and singleness of heart; through Christ our Lord. Amen.**
