# UPDATE ON OUR WELCOMING THE NEIGHBORHOOD PROJECT

As of June 26, our Vestry has approved moving forward with Phase I of our Welcoming the Neighborhood project.

# 1.INTERNAL RENOVATION OF THE CHILDREN'S CENTER BUILDING

New bathrooms, a new kitchen, new carpeting and flooring, new windows, new cabinetry and paint, and a new door into the playground area.



New fabric shade structures, new overhead lighting, new fencing, and new, beautiful landscaping around the perimeter.

### 3.ADDITION OF A COVERED WALKWAY

It will extend from the current Sanctuary walkway all the way to the Children's Center building.

4. INSTALLATION OF NEW FIBER-OPTIC CABLING TO HUTTON HALL AND THE 3 EDUCATION BUILDINGS New wi-fi installations and wiring for new phones and future security cameras.

Our architects, Chris Winters and Associates and Archicon, are preparing the detailed drawings for the Phase 1 project needed to obtain building permits from the Town of Paradise Valley.

We hope our general contractor, Redden Construction, and their subcontractors can start the installation and construction work in September and complete the work by the end of 2020.

While our campaign was put on hold in March due to the pandemic, we've been grateful and humbled by your continued gifts to this effort.

### WORSHIP IN CORONA - TIDE

Our worship life has certainly changed dramatically in our time apart! Worship is now found on our website: www.saintbarnabas.org on Sunday mornings. When you click "Worship" you'll find a service video with music, readings, prayers, and a sermon. At the request of our Bishop, we stopped offering "virtual communion" in April. However, we will begin offering Holy Communion once a month and you can stop by at designated hours to pick up blessed communion for you to receive at home or during brief prayer in the Sanctuary. We have tried to connect more intimately by offering some worship via Zoom, and we've also started offering Noonday Prayer via Facebook Live on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays. Though times are tough, the center of our life—worshipping—continues. We hope you will keep returning to our main website where you will always be able to find the links to what is happening each week!

# On July 19, we launched the next season of our Listening Initiative that we began in 2018. In response to the tragic death of George Floyd and the ensuing racial crisis in our nation, we began "Listening to Seek & Serve".

From the beginning, I have urged us to see this racial crisis as a human and spiritual need long before it is a political need. For sure, real and lasting societal change must finally express itself in how we are governed, but for us in the church, who call ourselves disciples of Jesus, we begin with seeing one another as Jesus sees us. We begin with following Jesus' profoundest model and teaching: The Incarnation. Solidarity with the whole human family.

Our Episcopal Baptismal Covenant expresses it this way: "Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself? Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?" So we began listening to the voices of Black Americans and listening to one another's responses through a video series made by our Presiding Bishop, The Most Rev. Michael Curry, and doing some reading together.

### ST. LUKE'S AT THE MOUNTAIN FARMER'S MARKET

The Farmer's Market on the 2nd/4th Saturdays at St. Luke's saw a significant rise in the number of families served monthly in April and May (352/312) compared to the usual ~275 families. The needed number of food boxes also sharply increased in March and April (96/75) compared to the usual 60. A need for delivery food boxes also rose. St. Luke's Food Pantry received 1,800 lbs of food from the May and June Saint Barnabas Food Drives, which was a tremendous blessing! 
### BLESSING OF LEARNING | AUG 9 DURING WORSHIP





Fall Family Formation Program | Sundays at 8:30am via Zoom | September 13-November 22

Beginning Sunday, September 13, our Episcopal Diocese of Arizona will offer a weekly formation program focusing on storytelling and themes of racial equality, specifically designed for elementary-school-aged children and their caregivers. This is a pivotal time for all of us—including, and perhaps especially, children—to listen to the stories of people of color and engage in a discussion of what it means to respect the dignity of every human being (BCP, p. 305).

We will engage in the program via a weekly Zoom session hosted by Ms. Sarah & our Sunday School teachers on Sundays at 8:30am, during which kids (and their parents, if so desired) will interact with games, discussions, and the occasional craft. The video lesson from the Diocese will be available on the Diocesan YouTube page, but the interactive component will happen with Saint Barnabas families on Sunday
