We are all likely familiar with the words of the hymn, "blessed be the ties that bind our hearts in Christian love." Maybe some of us are less familiar, though, with the ties that continue to grow and strengthen between Saint Barnabas and the Union of Black Episcopalians Karl and Virginia Washington Arizona Chapter ("UBE Arizona").

On September 7, Saint Barnabas hosted UBE Arizona's kick-off meeting for its new programming year. Twenty-eight Chapter members and guests from across the state gathered in the Music Center for a morning of food, fellowship, presentations, and planning. As the service component of the meeting, UBE Arizona members generously brought donations for the monthly Saint Barnabas Food Drive.

A highlight of the meeting was the fun, interactive presentation by the Diocese's new Canon for Black Ministry, Alex Leonard, on this, her first visit to Saint Barnabas. She told a bit about her background and what the role of Canon for Black Ministry is and can be; then, with the able assistance of Brayden Benedict, engaged the group in a real-time series of survey questions about their experiences and goals for UBE Arizona and how the Diocese can support them.



Saint Barnabas clergy, staff, and parishioners figured prominently in the event: Rev. Pam Bell, a long-time UBE Arizona member, cooked the delicious meal that started the day; parishioner Susan Tuttle, who serves on the UBE Executive Board as Corresponding Secretary, ran the support for the presentations; parishioner Kyle Tuttle was the photographer for the event; and Chris Falkenstein, our Director of Facilities, made sure everything was in place and ready to go throughout the day. (Parishioners John Farley and Jim Newman, who are also UBE Arizona members, were unable to attend.)

Among the featured presentations was a discussion of the successful May 4, 2024 and eagerly anticipated November 23, 2024 "Evening of Service to Family Promise of Greater Phoenix" at Saint Barnabas. In May, with the guidance and leadership of Rev. Susie Parker, eleven UBE Arizona volunteers had what was described as a "truly life changing" evening here at Saint Barnabas, serving the families of Family Promise. The experience was so powerful that an even larger group of UBE Arizona volunteers has already worked with Deacon Susie and made plans to serve Family Promise again in November!



It's a common question here at Saint Barnabas, where our three deacons play important roles. Deacons are a distinct but equal order of ministry alongside priests and bishops. They assist in public worship, lead prayers, proclaim the gospel, and prepare the table for Holy Eucharist. More importantly, deacons serve as a bridge between the church and the wider community, bringing the world's needs to the church. To become a deacon, one must complete training and formation and be ordained by a bishop. Arizona's Deacon Formation Academy provides this preparation. At Saint Barnabas, our deacons serve in various ways:

- ⊕ Rev. Pam Bell: Pastoral Care, Kitchen Ministry, and Confirmation.
- ⊕ Rev. Susie Parker: Missions and Outreach.
- ⊕ Venerable Sarah Getts: Liturgy support and lay ministries, previously served as Archdeacon to the Diocese of Arizona under Bishops Smith and Reddall.

In addition, they all assist in worship services, proclaim the Gospel, and provide pastoral care. As vocational deacons, they are permanent members of this ministry, not transitioning to the priesthood. Deacons in our diocese serve without salary, at the direction of the bishop.

► TAEHS | The ART of Engaging Holy Scripture | We have a few open slots for fall 2024


