FOOD DRIVE | Every third Sunday of the month, in front of the Music Center



Every month on the third Sunday, the Saint Barnabas community gathers donations to support our neighbors in need. Food can be dropped off between 7:30am and 10:15am in front of the Music Center, and for those who can't make it then, shopping carts are placed in the courtyard every Sunday to receive contributions. Whether through groceries or monetary gifts, your generosity continues to provide stability and hope for families across Phoenix.

This time we are especially encouraging

donations of pantry staples, household essentials, and easy meals or snacks for children. Each bag and each dollar makes a difference, and together we are helping to lift burdens and nourish both bodies and spirits. Our next collection will be on October 19 outside the Music Center from 7:30am to 10:15am—we look forward to seeing you there.

Across Phoenix, food insecurity remains a pressing challenge. Demand at food banks is higher than ever, and recent federal funding cuts have placed a strain on organizations that serve thousands of families. St. Mary's Food Bank, one of the largest providers in the region, has reported losing nearly a million pounds of food this summer alone. As a result, many food boxes now contain fewer items, even as more households line up for help. Local pantries are also feeling the impact, with some estruggling to keep shelves stocked while experiencing a surge in requests for assistance.

At the same time, new and creative efforts are emerging to meet these challenges. Organizations like Nourish PHX are working tirelessly to distribute food, clothing, and basic supplies, while groups such as Borderlands Produce

Rescue are finding ways to rescue fresh produce and redirect it to families who need it most. Despite the difficulties, these efforts remind us of what is possible when communities come together.

Here at Saint Barnabas, your gifts—whether food, funds, or time—become part of this larger story. They link us to a network of compassion that is carrying people through uncertain times. Thank you for

Our mission is to provide emergency shelter and services that help families move from homelessness to employment, permanent housing, and self-sufficiency. familypromiseaz.org

Since Family Promise of Greater Phoenix began in 2000, Saint Barnabas has supported their work by providing shelter, meals, and fellowship. Over 25 years, both the organization and our partnership have grown. Today, we host one week of housing and meals three to four times a year for up to four families at a time, assisting anywhere from 32 to over 100 parents and children annually. More than 120 parishioners, along with friends and civic partners, contribute to our welcoming volunteer family.

HOW WE SERVE

A boundless Welcome hosting week runs Sunday to Sunday. On the first Sunday, volunteers set up guest rooms in the Learning Center with inflatable beds, giving each family a private space. Families arrive each evening between 5 and 6pm from the Family Promise Day Center in Glendale, settle in, and join volunteers for dinner in Hutton Hall at 6pm. On the final Sunday, rooms are returned to their regular layout.

Each evening, three principal teams of boundless Welcome volunteers come together in service to our guest families:

• CHEF TEAM (5-8pm)

- -Cooks or brings main dish, sides, and dessert
- -Serves our guest families a buffet-style meal
- -Joins our guests for the evening meal
- -Sign up individually or with your friends and family!

• HOST TEAM (5-8pm)

- -Welcomes our guests and joins them for the evening meal
- -Helps Chef Team as/if needed (e.g. set tables, serve meal)
- -Spends time after dinner having fun with the children
- -Sign up individually or with your friends and family!

OVERNIGHT TEAM

(8pm-5:30am Sunday-Thursday, 8pm-7am Friday & Saturday)
-Stays overnight in the Learning Center Chaperone Room
(Library), providing the comfort of having a Saint Barnabas
parishioner on hand through the night and to see them off on
time in the morning. Online training is required. Spouses/partners,
friends, or even families are welcome to serve in this way!


A HABITAT BUILD IN HIS MEMORY



In late November or December, we will begin building a new home in the Sunnyslope area of north Phoenix at 8817 N. 2nd St. Lot #37114. It will be the same single-story, three-bedroom model we've built before. Fran and I are honored to sponsor this house in memory of our grandson, Jake Tilley, who died in Habitat an industrial accident two years ago. The Episcopal Habitat Coalition is the full sponsor, which means Saint Barnabas and our Episcopal partners can provide volunteers for every workday.

We hope you'll find a Thursday or Saturday to join us. This year we're using a new sign-up system that allows volunteers from any church to register for any open day. If spots remain, they'll be filled with general volunteers. The maximum number of volunteers per

day is set at registration.

After retiring in 2011, I connected with Saint Barnabas when Rev. Erika invited me to represent our church with Habitat for Humanity. Since then, I've spent many Saturdays building with the Episcopal Habitat Coalition, which has grown to 15 churches raising funds for two homes each year. This year, we're fully funding both projects: a renovation in South Central Phoenix and a new home in Sunnyslope. My wife Fran and I contributed to the Sunnyslope house in memory of our grandson, Jake Tilley, and Habitat will dedicate the home in his name.

Jake was 22, an Army veteran, and a Mesa High School graduate. He served as a Combat Engineer and loved building and working with his hands. Growing up, he always had projects to tinker with, and when he was old enough, he even joined me for a day on a Habitat site. He planned to come back after his Army service, but that chance never came. Building this house in his memory is a way to honor him and share his spirit of service. Construction is scheduled to begin in late November or early December and continue through April. We invite you to join us on a Saturday to help build Jake's House for a family who will treasure it. DELIVERING DREAMS BUS PROGRAM

Delivering Dreams of Arizona: Supporting Youth for Success



The **Delivering Dreams Bus Program** is the largest of six philanthropic efforts by **Delivering Dreams of Arizona.** For over 25 years, it has partnered with Title I schools to provide new school clothing to children living in poverty across Phoenix. In 2014–15 alone, 7,394 children received full uniforms, shoes, hygiene kits, and a book of their choice, thanks to the support of donors and volunteers.

Once or twice a month we go to an elementary school and help children get fitted for school uniforms and shoes. **Delivering Dreams of Arizona** has converted big busses into dressing rooms for the children. We also hand out books and toiletries! This is a great way to serve the community! WHAT IS STEWARDSHIP? By Phyllis Rector

What do you think when you hear the word Stewardship? Do you immediately think "Oh, they want money?" Stewardship has more than just that one component. The foundation of stewardship is rooted in **God** as Creator of everything.

Everything we have is a gift from God.

The first part of Stewardship is time. And, if we all think about it, time might be the most valuable gift that God has given to each of us. Many of us give lots of our time to support the work of Saint Barnabas as it builds the Kingdom of God. Some examples of how people have given of their time is volunteering in the office, being a Lay Eucharistic Minister, and staying overnight with our Family Promise families.

The second part of Stewardship focuses on "talent." What talents do you have? No, we aren't asking if you can sing. Talent can be thought of as gifts, or aptitude for something, or experience, or avocation. Often our talents are gifts God has given us and that we have learned through our lived experience. We usually know them through the satisfaction exercising them gives us. Have you been a teacher, an accountant, a project manager? Do you like to cook, are you the organizer in your family, do you like to help people in need?

These are just a few of the talents that we share at Saint Barnabas in building the Kingdom of God. After all, we are all part of one body because we share in one faith and love of God and Saint Barnabas.

The word "treasure" more clearly describes the monetary component of stewardship. However, the ancient word "tithe" helps us to more completely understand the complexity. Money is one part of the meaning, but just one part. Tithe means one tenth. Do you suppose that God is asking us to give one tenth of our time, one small fraction of our many talents or skills or gifts, as well as one tenth of our income or of our wealth? At Saint Barnabas we ask that you give, of your time, of your skills, and of your treasure in response to the gifts that you feel that God has given you.

Stewardship is comprised of three parts, time, talent, treasure, where the parts are inseparable one from the other. Time does not substitute for treasure. Treasure doesn't substitute for talent.

In November we will head into pledge season, where we will make our financial commitments to Saint Barnabas. How might God be asking you to respond?

CHEERS FOR THE BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS COMMITTEE

Did you notice our sanctuary looking brighter a few months ago? That was thanks to improved lighting installed by **Scott Johnson** and **John Martin**, members of the Buildings and Grounds Committee. This fall, the work will continue as Scott, John, and others update the pendant fixtures over the main sanctuary with energy-saving LED bulbs.

Lighting is just one of many projects taken on by the Buildings and Grounds Committee. With about a dozen members bringing expertise in construction, trades, design, and repair, the committee helps care for our facilities and grounds as an expression of love for our community. They work closely with Director of Facilities Chris Falkenstein and Director of Operations Quita Remick, who together keep watch for cracks,

leaks, and other issues before they become larger problems. Each year, the committee also conducts a full inspection of our aging buildings and grounds to ensure everything remains safe and welcoming.

In the past year alone, their work has included an energy audit, a structural audit, repairs to the Learning Center showers, fresh coatings for playground equipment, and countless smaller projects that may go unnoticed but make a big difference.

So the next time you're inspired by the beauty and care of our church campus, remember to thank Chris, Quita, and the Buildings and Grounds Committee. And if you have skills to share, they'd be glad to welcome you aboard.


