

Leader The ones who feed our minds and our bodies, and the ones with whom we share faith and break bread. (*silence...*)

Leader The ones who trust us with what they do not share with many; and the ones who treat as precious all we confide in them. (*silence...*)

Leader The ones who, tonight, we want to pray for; and the ones who, unasked, tonight will pray for us, (including the people next to us). (*silence...*)

Leader And let us thank God for the one to whom we are summoned, the one by whom we are sent, whose image we are, whose flesh we share, whose love is all: Jesus, our Savior and our friend.

Celebrant In the beginning, God made the whole world and everything in it. That means God made us, too! And God loves us and the whole world. Because God loves us, God lets us make our own choices. Sometimes, we make bad choices that hurt us or other people. And then God tries harder to get our attention and remind us to love each other. The Bible tells us stories of how different people have come close to God and God has come close to them.

God has seen all the bad choices that people have made. So God decided to come visit us in a very special way, to show us again how to love each other. God visited us and became human—a young man named Jesus. Jesus was careful to include all people as his friends. Some people didn't understand this, and became angry. They wanted to hurt Jesus; they even wanted to kill him.

Jesus knew he was going to die, and chose to die so we could live. On the night before he died, Jesus took the bread they were eating, and after he had given thanks to God, he broke it, and gave it to his friends, and said, "Take this bread and eat it. Let it be a reminder to you that I feed your soul by teaching you how to love yourself and each other. Whenever you eat it, do this to remember me."

After they were finished eating, Jesus took a cup of the wine they were drinking, and after he had given thanks to God, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, as a reminder of my promise to you of God's love. Whenever you drink it, do this to remember me."

Loving God, remembering now his suffering and death and proclaiming Jesus' resurrection and ascension we bring you these gifts. Bless them by your Holy Spirit to be for us, your people, the Body and Blood of Christ.

And send your Holy Spirit upon us, to gather us, by this Holy Communion, into one family in Christ. Make us a living reminder of your love.

Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and forever. Amen! Amen! Amen!

Celebrant When we eat and drink this holy food, it's not food for our hungry bodies. It's food for our hungry and tired hearts.
