


**Silence** This is a 4-5 minute period of silence.

#### **Kyrie**

Refrain is sung first by the cantor and then by all

The Congregation hums as the cantor sings the intercessions and repeats the Kyrie after each intercession.



(hum...) Lord, you make your peace shine out in our midst: may our hearts sing your praises forever. Kyrie...

(hum...) For the light of love to shine on all nations: may we walk the road to freedom. **Kyrie...** 

(hum...) For all believers, and those who do not yet know you: make your face shine upon us. **Kyrie...** 

(hum...) For all victims of injustice, violence, and illness, and for those who bring relief: in them, your praise forever.

(hum...) For all who have died in Christ: in them, your glory shines. **Kyrie**...

(hum...) For all you have entrusted to us:
may our hearts sing your praises forever. **Kyrie...**





The night heralds the dawn.


Let us look expectantly to a new day,
